RULES AND REGULATIONS

The ORILLIA & DISTRICT AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY (the “Society”) complies with the “Personal Information Protection & Electronic Documents Act”.

EXHIBITS:

1. ALL EXHIBITORS MUST BE REGISTERED for their event in the Society office and must be 2021 members. Exhibiting in the Orillia Fair is open to residents of Simcoe and adjoining counties.
2. Forms can be found online at www.orilliafallfair.com, and can be submitted by e-mail at odaspark@gmail.com by Tuesday September 7th at the latest. Make sure all information including sections and classes are clear and concise. Membership fees must accompany forms.
3. A Junior Fair membership is \$5.00 and entitles the holder to admission to the Orillia Fall Fair. The Junior Fair is for those aged pre-school to grade 12 as of September 7th, 2021.
4. Exhibit tags must be properly completed or risk being disqualified.
5. Exhibits must be delivered in person.
6. Exhibits not placed in the correct class or identified incorrectly or incompletely will be disqualified.
7. One exhibit per exhibitor in each section. No article is to be exhibited in more than one class or section.
8. All exhibits are to be selected and prepared by the exhibitor, and must not have been previously entered. Exhibits not placed by the exhibitor are subject to disqualification at the discretion of the committee in charge.
9. All stock, produce and manufactured goods must be owned by exhibitor for at least 30 days.
10. Grain, fruit, seeds, roots and garden produce entries must be grown in 2021 on land occupied by person entering.
11. All hall exhibits must be placed on Friday September 10th between 12:00pm and 7:00pm. Entries placed after this time will be disqualified.
12. In case of bad weather or any unforeseen circumstances, the Society reserves the right to cancel any sections or classes of the Fair as it deems necessary. It is recommended that exhibitors check with either the convenor of their section, the Fair Office, or our website to check on the status of their sections of classes.
13. All precautions are taken to safeguard exhibits but exhibitors enter at their own risk. If an exhibit is damaged, lost or stolen, the Society will only assist the exhibitor to recover same.
14. The Society and its Directors shall not be responsible for accidents on the grounds or injury to persons, animals, vehicles or other personal property belonging to those entering Fairgrounds. All persons attending the Fair and its events do so at their own risk.
15. The Society will NOT be liable for any loss to any exhibit from fire, accident, structural defect, or negligence of other exhibitors or officials.

JUDGING:

16. No unauthorized person is allowed in applicable area during judging. Authorized persons include Chairperson, Judges, assistants and any other person authorized by the Chairperson.
17. Fair Judging will commence on Friday at 7:30pm. The hall will be closed to all exhibitors until 10:00am on Saturday.
18. Decisions of judges are final and only written appeals with a \$10.00 fee will be considered. The fee will be returned if the appeal is successful.
19. All prizes will be awarded in cash in the fair office at 5:00pm on Saturday September 11th.

- Entries are judged on abilities of school-aged children. Please allow Junior Fair exhibitors to prepare their own exhibits.

Class 1 – Junior Crafts

PRIZES: 1st - \$5.00 2nd - \$4.00 3rd - \$3.00 All other entries \$1.00

Junior and Senior Kindergarten as of September current year

1. Crayon drawing of your family. Maximum 8.5"x11"
2. Treasures from a walk – a display of 6 items attached on white paper plate, not to exceed 10"
3. Print the word "Fair", decorate and mount. Maximum 8.5"x11"
4. Your favourite stuffed animal dressed for the fair.
5. A colourful maple leaf mounted on paper. Maximum size 8 ½"x11" (22x28cm).

Grade 1 & 2 as of September current year

6. Hand puppet made from a paper bag.
7. Leaf rubbing with coloured pencil. Maximum 8.5"x11"
8. Make a picture using potato printing. Maximum 8.5"x11"
9. Print your name and decorate. Maximum 8.5"x11"
10. Using playdough, plasticine, or clay create a fruit and a vegetable. Display on a paper plate max 10".
11. Make a duct tape tie.

Grade 3 & 4 as of September current year

12. A handmade Halloween decoration.
13. A handmade sock puppet.
14. Make your own slime (no borax). Display in a sandwich bag.
15. Hand-draw your first initial and decorate it on white paper. Maximum 8.5"x11"
16. Recycle an empty water bottle and make a birdfeeder (must be ready to hang).

Grade 5 & 6 as of September current year

17. A pencil drawing of a cartoon character, named. Colour with coloured pencils. Maximum 8.5"x11"
18. Decorate a clay pot, pot must be empty (no larger than 4" in diameter).
19. A popsicle stick creation (no larger than 10" in any direction). Display on a tray.
20. A pencil sketch, any subject. Maximum 8.5"x11".
21. A tin can lantern, hammer and nail created, votive candle inside.

Grade 7 & 8 as of September current year

22. An Inukshuk, mounted on a sturdy base, must be securely constructed and no more than 10" tall.
23. A charcoal drawing. Maximum 8.5"x11".
24. A Christmas decoration (not a tree ornament).
25. Create a Welcome sign.
26. Create a split picture by cutting any picture in half and recreate the missing half.

Grade 9-12 as of September current year

27. A popsicle ferris wheel structure on a sturdy base, not to exceed 12" in any direction.
28. An item of needlework.
29. Make a babysitter's kit, minimum of 8 items, place in a solid container.
30. An original work of art, any media, ready to be hung, not to exceed 30" in any direction. Artwork must be framed.
31. Punched tin can lantern depicting a character of theme. Include votive candle.

*Open to all youth up to age 15 as of December 31, 2021

The winner from each fair will be eligible to enter eight cookies in the District competition held in October. Prize money to be paid by District. The winner of the district competition is eligible to bake for the Provincial Competition in February.

1. Eight plain chocolate chip cookies (no nuts) between 2"-3" each displayed on a paper plate.

Class 3 – Junior Crops

PRIZES: 1st - \$5.00 2nd - \$4.00 3rd - \$3.00 All other entries \$1.00

RULES:

- If variety name is requested and not given, entry is disqualified.
- One exhibit per family allowed in sections 1, 2 & 3.
- In sections 2 & 3 product must be clear plastic bag.

SECTIONS:

1. 1 litre grain – 2021 crop – name variety.
2. 5 lbs mixed hay, first cut 2021 crop (must be in a clear plastic bag).
3. 5 lbs mixed hay, second cut 2021 crop (must be in a clear plastic bag).
4. Five apples, variety to be named.
5. Most unusual potato.
6. Two eggplants.
7. Oddest shaped carrot.
8. Five leeks.
9. Display of fresh garden herbs.
10. Largest onion.
11. Three tomatoes, green and stem on – not cherry.
12. Three ripe cherry tomatoes with stem on.
13. Three hot peppers. May be different kinds, named.
14. Three beets.
15. Fattest cucumber.
16. Largest squash.
17. Three heads of garlic.
18. Longest bean.
19. Vegetable mutation (ie 2 tomatoes growing together).
20. Longest zucchini.
21. Heaviest pumpkin.
22. Longest ear of corn.
23. Collection of five different homegrown vegetables, displayed on a tray or basket.
24. A decorated pumpkin (no Jack O'Lanterns), use beads, feathers, makeup etc.
25. Make a collection of six gourds, displayed in a decorative container.

Tips: Attach tags around vases with elastics. Put in suitable vase or container for height & weight of flower. Add water & rocks for weight if top heavy.

1. A bouquet of flowers, weeds, sticks etc.
2. A bouquet of cattails in a can. Total height not to exceed 30"
3. Flower Pie – flowers floating in a 9" pie plate in water.
4. One rose, single bloom.
5. Three stems of any perennial, named.
6. A bouquet of three petunias.
7. Make a fresh flower birthday centerpiece.
8. A face created on a large sunflower head by removing some of the seeds.
9. Three gladiolas.
10. Largest sunflower head.
11. Bouquet of Sedums.

12. Largest succulent.
13. Smallest sunflower head.
14. Most unique succulent.
15. Three geranium stems.
16. Three stems of cosmos with foliage.
17. Arrangement of three different succulents.
18. Create a small 3D display of a fall theme using real blooms, maximum 12"x12".

RULES:

- Each entry must be centered on cardstock or bristol board exposing a 2" border on all four sides.
- Poster size minimum 8 ½" x 11" and maximum 11"x17" without border.
- Name of fair, district #5, contact person, owner of poster is to be clearly labeled on the back of each entry.
- The winning poster from each section at each fair will be eligible to enter into the District competition in October. District winners are eligible to enter at the Provincial competition in February.

Age Groups: Up to Age 3 / Ages 4-6 / Ages 7-9 / Ages 10-14

Up to Age 3 – with Adult Guidance

1. Corn Husking – First one with all the husks off the cob wins. Adults may hold cob.
2. Animals in a Hay Stack – First child to find two toy animals in the stack wins.

Ages 4 to 6

1. Rubber Boot Toss – Rubber boot is thrown from behind a line. Each toss is marked by the furthest point of the boot.
2. Egg on a Spoon – Each participant will run towards the finish line with a plastic egg on a spoon. If the egg falls off it is picked up and the runner starts again.

Ages 7-9 and 10-13

1. Hay Bale Toss – A bale of hay is thrown from behind a line. Toss is marked by the furthest part of the bale.
2. Egg on a Spoon – Each participant will run towards the finish line with a chicken egg on a spoon. If the egg falls off a new egg is picked up and the runner starts again.
